



## A.W. JENKINSON FARMS


Located within the Eden Valley, the A.W. Jenkinson Farms set benchmark standards in bovine genetics, cattle, sheep and arable productivity. Throughout the holdings, the policy is one of continued improvement of land, livestock and facilities, tempered by a recognition that A.W. Jenkinson Farms are stewards of the land.

The Farm comprises six formerly separate holdings now operated as a single, efficient unit.

Activities on the Farm are centred on bovine genetics and breeding cattle, as well as sheep, arable and shooting land. The Limousin breeding herd comprises females which calve down to the Farm's high-quality pedigree stock bulls. The Farm also holds around 2,500 ewes; these Texel/North Country Mule crosses produce in excess of 4,000 lambs per year. The A.W. Jenkinson Farms' arable land contributes almost the entire feed requirements of the Farm, as well as providing a marketable surplus.

The Farm is entirely self-financed from within the A.W. Jenkinson Group. A high degree of investment in the latest machinery and farming innovations help drive maximum yield, whilst keeping use of agrochemicals to a cost-efficient, environmentally responsible minimum.





Whinfellpark Pedigree Breeding Services are centred on the provision of premium Limousin semen for insemination. The Farm owns some of the finest examples of bulls from the Limousin breed. #### THE BREEDING HERD



A.W. Jenkinson Farms maintain a breeding herd of around 150 pedigree Limousin females. Limousins are Britain's most popular breed of beef cattle; representing an excellent combination of meat quality and rate of maturation. Serviced by the Farm's high-quality stock bulls, their progeny are sold at Society Auctions, going on to improve other herds worldwide.

#### SHEEP FARMING



The Farm has a flock of some 2,500 ewes producing over 4,000 lambs which are marketed at the North's leading livestock auctions, providing animals for meat and premium breeding stock for other farms. The stock is crossed to achieve a 75% Texel/25% North Country Mule animal, offering high quality meat, whilst also ensuring the ewes have the excellent maternal instincts of the Mule. The flock is largely self-supporting, with only a few North Country Mules bought in each year to ensure a healthy genetic blend.

#### ARABLE FARMING



Around 1,000 acres are under arable rotation. Crops include winter wheat, oilseed rape, winter and spring barley, as well as silage. This makes the Farm almost self-sufficient in feed production. A high level of integrated IT is used throughout the Farm's vehicles to record yields and growth. Data is closely monitored by an agronomist to maximise production levels, whilst minimising use of agrochemicals and artificial fertilisers.

#### THE WHINFELL PARK SHOOT



The shoot represents a prestigious private operation that is dedicated to business and personal guests. The shoot team rear bought-in French Partridge and Pheasant poults; maintaining significant areas of wooded cover and game crops to support them. These tracts of mixed game cover not only ensure a lively shoot, but also contribute to the large wild bird population on the Farm.

#### STEWARDSHIP OF THE LAND

#### Wildlife

The Farm has a number of specially constructed features aimed at promoting biodiversity throughout the holding. The fully naturalised wildlife ponds exemplify this approach. Set in uncultivated natural areas, they provide a healthy natural habitat for amphibians, wildfowl and bird life. Despite the high productivity of the carefully improved and maintained land, the Farm has turned over a number of broad swathes to game feed crops. These areas not only improve shooting by providing food and shelter for game birds, but also encourage a broad spectrum of other wildlife.

#### Dry Stone Walling

A.W. Jenkinson Farms demonstrate that exceptionally high efficiency can go hand in hand with solid traditional land husbandry. Wherever possible, field and property boundaries are established with traditional Westmorland walling. The Farm prides itself on maintaining, repairing and extending old walls, adding character to the holdings, as well as providing an excellent enclosure for sheep and cattle.

#### Sympathetic Development

The construction of large scale steel sheds and storage facilities are essential for servicing the modern farmed environment. In line with A.W. Jenkinson Farms' holistic approach to the holdings, buildings are carefully designed and positioned to make minimal visual and physical impact on their environment.

### Technology and the Land

A.W. Jenkinson Farms use advanced technology to record crop yields and quality, which are automatically recorded during harvest and are cross-referenced with GPS co-ordinates. This data is used to identify areas of reduced fertility or potential disease which can then be addressed during treatment with fertilisers and pesticides later in the year. This information plays an important part in reducing the expense and possible environmental damage that results from over-use of chemicals and artificial fertiliser.

## THE BREEDING HERD

The Whinfellpark herd comprises a group of around 150 pedigree Limousin breeding females, the majority of which are the progeny of the Farm's various stock bulls. Their primary purpose is to provide a significant number of high quality calves, which are sold on at leading specialist sales events. Each year the Farm retains a number of exceptional females, which are utilised in further enriching A.W. Jenkinson Farms' genetic stock.

As with every area of the A.W. Jenkinson Farms' operation, IT plays a pivotal role in recording the health, development and history of each animal. Data is stored both centrally and directly on the animals themselves using a chipped tag that is scanned with a handheld unit to upload or download information instantly.

The A.W. Jenkinson Farms' system extends far beyond the statutory requirements of modern cattle rearing, to give a complete record of medical history, breeding and calving. This total picture is an important factor in planning the nutrition, supplements, treatments and future breeding mix of each animal in order to develop the finest herd possible.

# HANDLED WITH CARE

In 2017, following several successful shows for the Whinfellpark Limousins team, the decision was taken to buy a bespoke trailer in order to accommodate not only the cattle but also the stockmen.

This 45ft trailer, custom built by Houghton Parkhouse of Milnthorpe, is used to transport the A.W. Jenkinson Farm's' pedigree Limousins across the country, taking them to prestigious National and Local shows, National Limousin Society sales, and also delivering cattle to Whinfellpark Limousin customers throughout the UK. The trailer can be pulled by any one of the six hundred A.W. Jenkinson Transport Limited units.

Houghton Parkhouse were selected as the preferred supplier and manufacturer not simply as they are a local company but because their industry-leading innovations and award-winning designers ensured the best environment for both animals and stockmen. Working closely with the design team, the trailer was configured with a step frame, a single deck using the whole of the lower area for stock and an upper level step frame area as living space for the stockmen, allowing them to remain close to the livestock whilst at overnight events.

This gives the Whinfellpark Limousins team all the capacity needed for their show requirements in terms of stock numbers and staff accommodation. Additionally, there is the option of reverting the whole trailer back to stock accommodation whenever it is necessary.

Ultimately, the trailer ensures that A.W. Jenkinson Farms' most valuable assets – animals and staff can travel in the safest and most comfortable vehicle available

# SHEEP FARMING

For A.W. Jenkinson Farms, as with so many North Country holdings, sheep farming is a core activity. The countryside of the Eden Valley is ideally suited to breeding quality sheep for meat.

A.W. Jenkinson Farms maintain a standing flock of some 2,500 North Country Mule/Texel cross ewes. These sheep are covered by Texel rams to produce around 4,000 lambs each year. This cross-bred stock offers high quality meat, whilst at the same time offering ewes with the excellent maternal instincts of the Mule; helping ensure the lambs go to market in exceptional condition.

Lambing takes place under the cover of a series of purpose-built sheds, which offer spacious, low-stress surroundings that keep the young lambs safe from exposure, predators and disease, achieving excellent early development and keeping mortality to a minimum.



















# ARABLE FARMING

Around 1,000 acres of the A.W. Jenkinson Farms are given over to an arable rotation each year. Crops are grown, maintained and harvested entirely by the A.W. Jenkinson Farms' team using their extensive fleet of wholly-owned high-specification tractors and machinery.

Livestock feed provision is the primary consideration in deciding what is grown on the holdings. The key crops are winter wheat, oilseed rape and winter and spring barley. As a result, the Farm is almost self-sufficient in feed production, with a surplus of wheat, barley and oilseed rape being sold on the open market.

A.W Jenkinson Farms' arable activities benefit from the extensive use of the latest integrated GPS-referenced IT. Variations in soil nutrient balance are highlighted through targeted analysis by the Farm's agronomist. Evidence of disease or lack of nutrients is also pinpointed and treated within specific areas of a field using computer-controlled variable rate spreading technology.

Combining this close control of disease with nutrients from the manure of the Farm's over-wintering stock maximises production whilst minimising use of agrochemicals and artificial fertilisers; cutting the risk of potentially damaging run-off to the local watercourses.

## PREPARATION/TILLING

Modern minimum tillage techniques play an important role in maintaining moisture content and soil structure; breaking stubble into the topsoil to add organic matter.



Mid-autumn sees the fields sown with winter cereal varieties. Tractors with satellite-controlled steering ensure efficient drilling of seed in good time before the first of the winter frosts.



## 3 FERTILISING

Nitrogen, potash and phosphate fertilisers are spread as the ground starts to warm in spring; giving the over-wintered cereal crops an early boost. Carefully targeted GPS-controlled application of fertilisers optimises levels through regular, close monitoring.



## 4 SPRAYING

Throughout the growing season A.W. Jenkinson Farms' crops are sprayed using our high-specification self-propelled sprayer. With advice from the Farm's agronomist, chemicals are applied to control disease and deficiencies in growing crops whilst minimising any harmful environmental effects.



## 5 RIPENING

The heat of the Cumbrian summer sees crops planted in the preceding autumn rapidly come into maturity. As the seed ripens the fields turn from green to gold signalling the arrival of harvest time.



## 6 HARVESTING

The last days of summer bring the harvest before the weather turns. A.W. Jenkinson Farms utilise their own high-specification Combine Harvester.



## 7 BAILING

After the grain has been harvested, the straw is collected and packed into modern high density bales that speed up collection times and minimise storage requirements. Straw goes for winter bedding and feed in the lambing and cattle sheds, with surplus material marketed locally.



## 8 DRYING

Harvested grain is dried to achieve optimal moisture levels and is kept in the Farm's extensive stores. Cereals are utilised for winter cattle, sheep and game feeds, with any surplus going to market throughout the winter months.











# GRAIN DRYER

The summer of 2017 saw a major investment in the future efficiency of the A.W. Jenkinson Farms with the completion of a new grain terminal, including a fully automatic grain dryer and increased grain storage up to nearly 3,000 tonnes.

From the combine, the grain is transported 16 tonnes at a time to the Farm's grain terminal, where it is tipped into the ground reception pit. The grain is then moved into one of the two 200 tonne storage bins to await drying and cleaning. Once the drying system is activated, 25 tonnes will be moved from the storage bin to the dryer, where the gas-powered burners reduce the grain moisture content to 14.5%. It will then be cooled before being discharged into the main store, then the cycle will begin again.

All this filling, drying, cooling and emptying can be done continuously without any manual intervention, and if required it can run up to 24 hours a day. This leaves the A.W. Jenkinson Farms' staff available to concentrate on other seasonal work at their busiest time of the year.

Once dry and clean, the wheat, barley and oilseed rape can be stored separately until it is either used by the Farm's livestock in their winter rations, sold into the brewing industry or sold to livestock feed manufactures, which make up the majority of the Farm's sales.





# SILAGE PRODUCTION

Much of A.W. Jenkinson Farms' acreage of grassland is given over to silage production, helping make the holdings largely self-sufficient in terms of winter fodder.

The Farm's policy of growing its own cereals and silage grass helps ensure the quality and consistency of animal feed through the winter months. Control of nutritional quality plays a pivotal role in maintaining the herd's premium condition, minimising fallen livestock and ensuring females produce superb, healthy and well-developed calves.

The lush green meadows are cut when their nutritional value is at its maximum. The new-mown grass is initially left in the fields, being machine-turned regularly as it dries.

Once the ideal moisture content has been achieved under the drying warmth of the summer sun, the grass is harvested and transported to the Farm's large 'pit' where it is ensiled. As the pit or 'clamp' fills, it is compacted using a tractor with additional wide wheels.

Finally, the entire pit is sealed and is further compressed with weights placed on top. This process cuts oxygen levels beneath the surface to a minimum, preventing rotting as the grass undergoes a process of natural anaerobic fermentation to become silage; maximising its storage life whilst maintaining excellent nutritional value.
